
















Lux Mundi Nursery and Primary School Community: Kossala, Kumba

Blessed with an educational expert as founder, the school resolidified its engagement to being "The Light" to the community; as its name translates through providing education at low cost to the children of the community.



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
















Catholic Nursery and Primary School Community: Ekombe

With books and other learning materials distributed to the children, we left behind some extra text books and readers for the make-shift library to even facilitate studies.




































Tim's Memorial Nursery and Primary School Community: Ekombe


